ORDERED that nothing in this Order shall modify or alter the rights and obligations of any parties provided for under the terms and conditions of the Axis Policies; and it is further

ORDERED that nothing in this Order shall constitute a determination that the

proceeds of the Axis Policies are property of the Debtors' estates; and it is further

ORDERED that all parties to the Axis Policies reserve all rights and defenses that

they would otherwise have; and it is further

ORDERED that the fourteen day stay provided by Bankruptcy Rule 4001(a)(3) is

waived; and it is further

ORDERED that this Court retains jurisdiction with respect to all matters arising

from or related to the implementation of this Order.
